IDENTITY: Exploring Veteran Narratives Through Art + Music Opening October 29 at the National Veterans Memorial and Museum

Join the NVMM for Opening Night; October 28, 6-8 p.m.

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The <u>National Veterans Memorial and Museum</u> (NVMM) today announced the October 29 opening of <u>IDENTITY: Exploring Veteran Narratives Through Art + Music</u>, a new exhibition created in collaboration with CreatiVets, a nonprofit organization empowering Veteran healing through the arts. This is the first time a display of Veteran art resulting from CreatiVets classes has been curated for a museum exhibition.

"Thanks to our generous sponsors, we are proud to introduce an exhibition that reveals the healing benefits of Veteran story-telling through art," said Lt. General Michael Ferriter, U.S. Army (Retired), president and CEO of the National Veterans Memorial and Museum. "Art provides another tool we can utilize to combat Veteran suicide, post-traumatic stress and traumatic brain injury."

"Discovering concept-based art and the power of songwriting saved my life," said Richard Casper, U.S. Army Veteran and co-founder of CreatiVets. "It was like I'd found this loophole -- I found a way to talk about it, without talking about it. After what it did for me, I knew it could help other Veterans as well, and that's what I wanted to do through CreatiVets."

IDENTITY: Exploring Veteran Narratives Through Art + Music is comprised of 21 works spanning mediums from painting and sculpture to metalwork and songs, each piece created by a different Veteran and sharing a portion of their respective stories. Many of the Veterans represented in IDENTITY are working through traumatic brain injury or post-traumatic stress and have discovered making art has positively impacted their healing process and increased their connection to the world around them.

The NVMM and CreatiVets will offer four Veteran art classes at the museum during the run of *IDENTITY* as part of the NVMM's resilience and wellness programming. The first session will be a painting class on November 18 led by Shawn Augustson, U.S. Army Veteran, and Central Ohio-based artist. Successive classes include: Collage with Wayne Brezinka on January 13, 2023; Studio Photography with Jason Myers in February and Songwriting/Writers Round Concert in March.

CreatiVets is a nonprofit organization that empowers wounded Veterans to heal by sharing their stories and experience through the arts. Richard Casper co-founded CreatiVets after experiencing firsthand the healing power of art and music. As an infantryman, Richard served in Iraq with the U.S. Marine Corps where he lost a close friend while on patrol, survived four separate improvised explosive device attacks, suffered multiple concussions and was ultimately diagnosed with post-traumatic stress and traumatic brain injury. On his journey to wellness, Casper discovered the therapeutic benefits of art and music, and realized that creative expression was the only thing that really helped him. Richard took ceramics and painting courses and was amazed at how quickly he began to experience a positive impact.
