COLUMBUS, Ohio – Join the <u>National Veterans Memorial and Museum (NVMM)</u> for two engaging evenings of entertainment on Friday, December 9 and Saturday, December 10. Ease your way into the holidays with the poetry of U.S. Army Veteran, Amy Sexauer who will read from her new book, "Poppies," on Friday evening followed by an open mic for aspiring poets to connect and share their works as well.

Return on Saturday for a daytime journaling workshop with the Veteran-owned and operated publishers of the Dead Reckoning Collective. Saturday evening, the NVMM presents a night of laughs with the GIs of Comedy led by Thom Tran, a U.S. Army combat Veteran and professional stand-up comedian who regularly performs at the Laugh Factory and other venues in California.

Poetry and Open Mic Night: December 9 | 6:30 p.m. | FREE

Join the NVMM for a night of creative expression with Amy Sexauer, U.S. Army Veteran and author, for a live poetry reading from her debut book, "Poppies," from publisher, Dead Reckoning Collective. Sexauer's book details one woman's journey through war, loss and change. There will be time for discussion followed by an open mic for guests to share their own poetry and works. Light refreshments will be provided.

Journaling Workshop: December 10 | 11 a.m. | FREE

Learn from the founders and editors of Dead Reckoning Collective, a Veteranowned and operated publisher, during a hands-on workshop. They will share a variety of journaling options, how to get started and methods to incorporate other creative endeavors into the practice of journaling. While there are no rules for journaling, the focus will be on how to regularly examine experiences and new, expressive ways to process stories.

GIs of Comedy Night at the Museum: December 10 | 7 p.m. | \$25

NVMM Comedy Night headliner, Thom Tran, U.S. Army Veteran, founded The GIs of Comedy troupe of troops that has toured across the country and internationally, bringing the healing power of laughter to both military and civilian audiences. Tran has turned a lifetime of war into a successful career as a standup comic after a combat injury ended his military career. He also is one of 25 Veterans featured in the NVMM permanent exhibition alcoves.







Joining Tran for Comedy Night at the museum are Veterans <u>Walter Campbell</u> and <u>Jose Barrientos</u>. During his 20 years of active duty with the U.S. Air Force, Campbell was selected to join the premiere entertainment ensemble, Tops in Blue and performed with the All-Stars Tour for deployed service members serving abroad. He has performed in more than 25 countries including a pit stop at NASCAR's Daytona 500 in 2002. Campbell has been performing with the GIs of Comedy since 2016.

Jose Barrientos began his comedy career in Baghdad, Iraq, while serving in the U.S. Army. After realizing he was a better comedian than a soldier, he relocated to San Diego and then to Los Angeles where he now performs. Barrientos has been featured for his pranks on ABC's "20/20."
