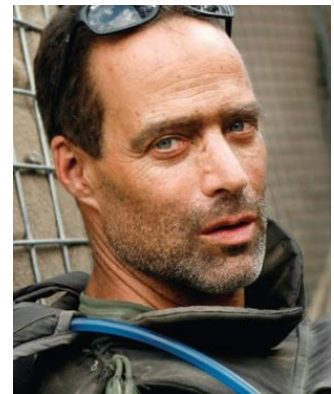
Vets Town Hall: November 10, 10 a.m. (Free)

An Evening with Sebastian Junger: November 10, 6 p.m.

Experience an unforgettable evening with Sebastian Junger, war correspondent and bestselling author of [“Tribe: On homecoming and Belonging:”](#) “War,” about American soldiers in Afghanistan’s infamous Korengal Valley; “The Perfect Storm,” about the crew of the Andrea Gail and more. Junger’s documentary, “Restrepo,” which he shot, directed and produced with photojournalist Tim Hetherington, won the Grand Jury Prize at the 2010 Sundance Film Festival and was nominated for an Oscar.
