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First Class of Graduates with Certificate in Public and Nonprofit Leadership for Veterans

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- Sixteen professionals, representing a wide range of employers from Ohio and Northern Kentucky, completed the first Certificate in Public and Nonprofit Leadership for Veterans through The Ohio State University's John Glenn College of Public Affairs. The pilot program was launched in February in partnership with the National Veterans Memorial and Museum with funding from Battelle and the Columbus Downtown Development Corporation.

"Military service is the best on-the-job leadership training in the world," said Lt. General Michael Ferriter, President and CEO for the National Veterans Memorial and Museum. "Veterans bring so much to the workplace, but it is important to help them invest in professional development to continue to grow and thrive in their civilian careers. This is what this program is all about."

The Certificate in Public and Nonprofit Leadership for Veterans is a 12-session program spread across five months that aims to help Veterans transition from the clear organizational structure and culture of military life to the more ambiguous organizational structure and culture of civilian organizations. It is a graduate-level program where participants acquire six credit hours that are transferable to any of the graduate degrees at the Glenn College.

The pilot class met at the National Veterans Memorial and Museum on Fridays and then quickly transitioned to online course delivery for the remainder of the sessions.

This fall, the program will be offered entirely online, enabling Veterans and their supporters from across the country to participate. "The certificate consists of two courses, each worth three credit hours. The first addresses leadership in public and nonprofit organizations; the second in leadership development application," explained Glenn College Professor Jos C.N. Raadschelders, faculty director of Professional Development and Training Programs. "As with all the Glenn College's professional development programs, the emphasis is on experiential knowledge. This means the experience of Veterans in leadership positions is actively used to help illustrate the general principles of organization and management."
